

"The day is coming, and it is close upon us, when every phase of character will be revealed by special temptation." YI 1-16-96:3.

Is normal everyday sin not sufficiently enticing that God must order special inducements to test His people? Apparently not.

In Numbers 23, we find Israel camped on the border of the Promised Land. On the Canaanite side of that border is a Moabite king, terrified. He knows he's toast unless he can manage to foil the Israelite advance. To avert disaster, King Balak sends for Balaam, a pseudo prophet, with an odd reputation. "I know that he whom you bless is blessed," said Balak, flattering the prophet, "and he whom you curse is cursed." Numbers 22:6.

The power to curse or bless would certainly be an interesting tool, but for Balaam, cursing Israel at this time is inconceivable, and he knows it. He tries anyway and fails miserably. "Behold, I have received commandment to bless:" he tells the king, "and He has blessed; and I cannot reverse it." Numbers 23:8. What's wrong, has he lost his touch? Actually, nothing is wrong; something is right: "God has not beheld iniquity in Jacob, neither has He seen perverseness in Israel: the Lord his God is with him." Numbers 23: 21.

Israel is a nation of one million, two maybe, and the whole body is pronounced righteous. Imagine that. They can't be cursed. They can't be impoverished, they can't be sickened, they can't be weakened, nor can they be stopped. They can't even be made to slow down, because they are judged upright. And they are upright through the atoning sacrifice of Jesus Christ. As far as known sin is concerned, they are clean. But now watch: They are on the verge of entering Canaan. This is an important fact. Canaan represents heaven, in type. What if there are unknown sins in the lives of those people? Are they allowed to enter Canaan land? No. "There shall in no wise enter into it (earthly or heavenly Canaan) any thing that defiles." Revelation 21:27. So as not to soil heaven, in type, God must allow circumstances to reveal what is in their hearts that they may deal with it.

To affect this, the Spirit of God leaves Balaam to be controlled by a cultivated covetousness. And wouldn't you know it, Satan is right there with an inspiring suggestion. "You can't curse Israel," whispers the enemy, "ah, but they could curse themselves, and here's how . . ." Greedy for gain and armed with a new thought, Balaam puts the plan into action. Before it's over, 24,000 people are dead.

What happened? Some special females with evil designs sauntered into camp, and "The people began to commit whoredom with them." Numbers 25:1. The very ones who couldn't be cursed and might have defeated their enemies in battle were "overcome by the wiles of women." Patriarch and Prophets 454:4

Radio Broadcast in India

People in India are tuning into our TV broadcasts as Pastor Elisha Rao presents "The Book of Revelation". As a result more than 350 pastors are taking Bible studies; and the interest is spreading among the Lombardi Gypsies. Initially, five young men received Bible studies and accepted the gospel truth. They are now working in 30 villages and have led twenty five Lombardi young men to train as SDA pastors. There is also a growing movement among Muslims, and many have called to express their

lims, and many have called to express their awakening interest in Adventism. We continue to get phone calls from individuals watching the program on their computers in the USA and the Gulf countries.

Our newest orphanage has become a great blessing to many children from very remote villages. Several children, whose parents want their children to get a good education, have sent their children from these remote villages to board with our orphans. These villages are so remote that they have to walk many miles to catch a bus; and then, walk many more miles to the nearest school. Danger lurks as tigers walk down the streets at dusk and after dark.

The first orphanage is still growing and doing well! Growing from 35 children to 89 permanent residents. The Government of India tried to force us to close the school because the class rooms were getting too crowded. Praise the Lord, the Quiet Hour became interested and donated money to build 6 new classrooms, plus a science room and cafeteria.

Our orphanages are all in rented facilities. We would like to buy land and build new orphanages. We have some land and a partly

finished building. We need \$10,000 to finish this building for occupancy.

Preparations for Winter

With open arms, we welcome Takayuki Konno and his family to Mount Akagi. Returning after several years, he is a great blessing to us.

The winters in Japan can be quite severe; in the past several weeks, we were busy cutting and collecting firewood. The old wood stove needed to be repaired, and we didn't know how to repair it. All of the fire bricks were broken, the rails that hold the bricks were broken loose, some parts of the stove were warped due to excessive heat,

and many of the welds were broken. Konno-san was able to weld the stove back together.

The bakery roof made from concrete developed a leak along the joint. In one section, the leak is very persistent.

How did God fix this problem? He brought Konno-san back to us. For many years he worked for a company that waterproofs buildings. The material is very expensive, but his old company gave it to us for free. The primer and secondary coats were applied and the roof no longer leaks. The final layer will keep the ultraviolet rays from weakening the waterproofing material.

If possible, we would like to repair the flooring in the bakery office. He has given us evidence of His leading. He has always provided for us, and we know that we can trust Him still.

There are two industries that Mt Akagi would like to pursue to become fully self-supporting. The first, is to purchase a grain

"puffing" machine that would allow us to provide puffed rice, wheat, corn, barley or other grains that the people could use for nutritious meals, and to allow us to develop other new bakery products.

The second is to build an American-style greenhouse with larger pipes for the frame and a stronger plastic covering. We want to start an agriculture program, because we are told that it is the ABC's of Christian educa-

tion. Our growing season is 4 to 6 weeks shorter than at the foot of the mountain, and a greenhouse would extend our growing season. If we can do something a little different, perhaps we can generate some interest and attract people to come to Mt Akagi. The materials for a typical Japanese-style greenhouse are available, but they would not stand up against the strong winds at Mt Akagi.

We solicit your prayers and support. Winter is settling over the whole earth. Will Japan be ready for the pending crisis?



"A Powerful God"

Eden Valley Foster Care Mission (EVFM) Continues to find its source of power in God; but only recently, it was connected to the Tanzanian electrical power grid. With the nearest public power resource over 25 miles away, Janet Fournier, the mission Director, has been looking for a method to power the campus with electricity. Over the past few years, she has been working with Jay Anders, a professional hydro-electrical engineer from Chattanooga, Tennessee, and her avid supporters to raise the required funds for the project; and design a hydro power plant that could harness the power of the small river that runs next to the campus.

In early August, after six months of detailed planning and preparation, EVFM began to get the campus ready for the electrical power plant that would be installed in early October. The local team worked long days to dig the necessary trenches and clear them of rocks and boulders; these ditches would house the cables and water pipes

that supply water to power the hydro generators.

Jay and seven members of the East Ridge SDA Church were making plans to come onsite to help build the hydro plant, a small weir (a barrier across a small river to act as a dam), powerhouse, and a battery room to help store and distribute the power to the entire

campus. After traveling over 24 hours, they arrived in Dar Es Salaam on October 7. They would continue driving another 13 hours before they would arrive safely at EVFM.

The next morning, they started to work in earnest. Every morning began with a time of prayer and praise. It was the key to the success of the project. During this time, the team shared ways God had provided

wisdom and insight to meet the daily challenges and obstacles that came their way. He reminded them that this was His mission and that they needed His help. True to His word, God continually provided help in their time of need.

Over a mile of cable was placed across the campus. God surprised the group by providing a large cable to cover only the first 400

The initial goal is to repair the buildings at the school to provide the needed housing for the students attending the training program in May. 

How Unquenchable is Your Thirst?

Have you ever been real thirsty? I'm not talking about your average thirst. What I'm talking about is an unquenchable thirst—a thirst that you are willing to do anything to satisfy. I have. I was camping with a friend and the closest convenience store was hours away. I was desperate. Every fiber of my being cried for water.

Jesus thirsted. Yes, He thirsted for physical water, but His unquenchable thirst was for you and me. He longed to offer men and women the gift of salvation even more than the pains of hunger or thirst.

Are you thirsty? Is your thirst driven by the desire to share the gospel with those around you?

John 4:7 tells us as Jesus sat by the well in Sychar, "There came a woman of Samaria to draw water." This woman came with a physical need. When she left, her need was met and she was filled with "The Water of Life". Jesus reveals in this encounter a beautiful method of evangelism.

First, He saw the woman was there because she had a need. She was looking for relief, physical relief. When we seek to relieve the practical needs of individuals, their hearts become open to the gospel. We are told when we "relieve the physical necessities of your fellow men, their gratitude will break down the barrier, and enable us to reach their hearts." 9T 127.

Secondly, He inspired hope in eternal life. He said, "If you knew the gift of God. . . you would have asked of him, and He would have given you living water." This water Jesus gives is a "well of water springing up into everlasting life." This well is symbolic of medical missionary work. Sitting before Jesus is a woman living in sin. She

knew her condition. Jesus knew her condition. Instead of condemning her, Jesus instilled in her hope—hope that

eternal life was within her reach. Today, the same opportunity presents itself to us. People are saturated with sin, in great need, and seeking only a temporal solution. What do you and I have to offer?

Thirdly, He made it clear that in Him

there is power. Jesus said in vs. 13, "who ever drinks of this water will never thirst again." When an individual continues to drink from the life-giving stream, they experience the life-giving power of Christ. The old cisterns of the world no longer satisfy their thirst. They no longer desire to return to their old way of life.

Are you thirsty? Friend, come to THE WELL at Eden Valley Institute in Loveland, Colorado. THE WELL is a missionary training program designed to teach Christ's methods in evangelism.
